4. Professional adjustment- In this case, a person earns respect in his or her field by treating his or her co-workers fairly, as well as satisfaction and fulfilment from his or her business.

5. Constructive adjustment- When a youngster addresses an issue in a creative way, this is referred to as formative adjustment. For instance, increasing efforts to achieve the goal, considering the situation from several angles, seeking appropriate counsel from others, and so forth.

6. Substituted adjustment- If the child's efforts do not result in the anticipated result, he might compensate by replacing a restricted aim.

Procedure for Adjusting

R. P. Singh and A.K. P. Sinha's adjustment scale was employed in this study.

The current study used the survey method as its research method.

The research study's limitations For the sake of this research, the following limits have been established.

1. The current study focused solely on girls enrolled in Ambedkar Nagar's Intermediate and High Schools.
2. Only girls between the ages of 15 and 17 were included in the study.

Interpretation and Analysis

Girls in Intermediate classrooms will have no notable differences in their adjustment.

At the higher adjustment level, Table No. 1 indicates the mean 31.72 standard deviation 5.17 of urban girls and the mean 45.6 standard deviation 9.19 of rural girls. At the 0.05 and 0.01 levels of significance, the "t" value 0.71 shows a less significant difference. As a result, both urban and rural girls have a similar level of higher adjustment.

Urban girls have a mean 32.65 standard deviation 5.65 and rural girls 47.08 have a standard deviation 6.93 at the low adjustment level. At the 0.05 and 0.01 levels of significance, the "t" value 0.75 is not significant. As a result, urban and rural females have similar levels of low adjustment. The hypothesis stated above is correct.

In terms of adaptability, there will be no notable differences between girls in Intermediate classes.

The comparison of adjustment of urban and rural girls is shown in Table 2. The average social adjustment for urban females is 13.30 and for rural girls is 14.02. 1.44 "t" value at the 0.05 and 0.01 levels, there was no significant difference in value. As a result, both urban and rural females have the same level of social adjustment.

The mean emotional adjustment scale for urban females is 13.98, while it is 13.37 for rural girls. At the 0.05 and 0.01 levels, there is no significant change in value. As a result, both urban and rural females have the same level of emotional adjustment.

In terms of educational adjustment, urban females have a mean of 14.22 and rural girls have a mean of 14.99. At the 1.55 0.05 and 0.01 level, there is no significant change in the "t" value. As a result, there is no difference in educational adjustment between urban and rural girls.
