complexities of the current market and select mutual funds that align with their overall investment strategy (Financial Times, 2024) [5].

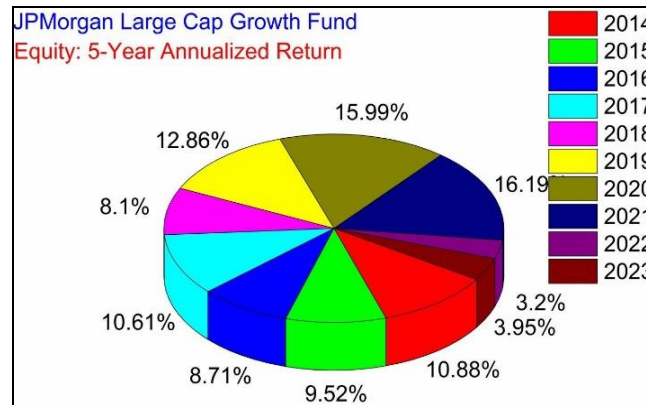


Fig 2: Showing the Performance of Selected JPMorgan Large cap Growth Funds, Equity type Fund for 10-Year Annualized Return i.e the average annual return over the past ten years (2014-2023)
